Was a big week with a whole lot of Volleyball action. Last Thursday we played St Paul Academy for the first time winning 2 sets.

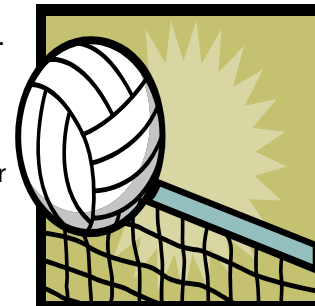
