## Swim Team

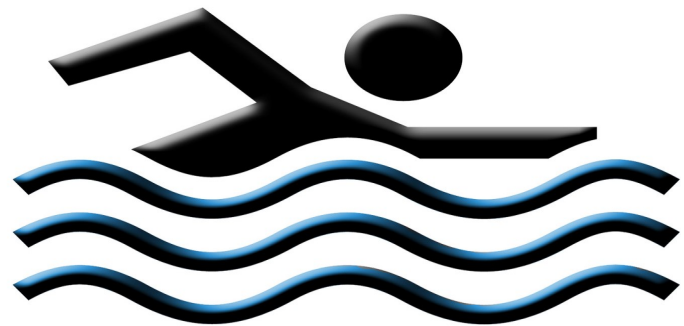
