Tigers Boys Baseball Upcoming Games

1st Playoff Game

The 8th grade baseball team made it into the playoffs for the fourth consecutive year. Their first round match up was against St Croix Lutheran out of West St Paul. St Croix played in the other league and finished top in their league. But the Tigers are a battle tested team having played in the National League against some tough competition. The Tigers got on the scoreboard in the top of the first when Joseph "Just Keep Running" Koch was hit by a pitch, stole second, stole third and then went home on the overthrow from the catcher. For the next few innings, the game was a pitcher's duel. Matthew "The Money Man" Varela came back from the DL to get the Tigers' first hit of the game and start to crack the door open on their pitcher. In the top of the 5th, Nolan "I Can Hang with the 8th Graders" Moynagh had a nice base hit to get the inning going. We ended up manufacturing two runs in the inning. St Croix Lutheran found a way to squeak one run in in the bottom of the 5th inning to put the score at 3-1 Tigers. In the top of the 6th inning, we got two runners on by having excellent patience at the plate. 7th grader Alex "Sacrificing Myself for the Team" Hopkins laid down a perfect sacrifice bunt to move our two runners into scoring position. Jack "Two is Better than One" Schoenecker then came up a ripped a double into the right-center field gap to score those two runs. The Tigers scored one more in the inning to go up 6-1. Jack "In Command the Whole Time" Schoenecker went back to the pitcher's mound to finish what he had started. In between a couple of walks, he struck three batters out to end the game and finish with twelve strikeouts for a 6-1 Tigers victory.

2nd Playoff Game

In the semifinal playoff game, the Tigers were matched up against the St Agnes Aggies and a lovely Monday afternoon. Now if you are paying attention, that is also the same day as the 8th grade class trip to Valleyfair. So the boys cut out of their trip early to continue their championship run. The game went into the bottom of the sixth inning with the Tigers leading 5-3. The Aggies were not done and proceeded to score one run and then get runners on second and third with their best hitter at the plate. But Jack threw a timely, knee-buckling curve ball that froze the kid to get a strikeout and then he struck out the last kid to end the Aggies season and send the Tigers to the championship game. This was a total team effort by the Tigers with the line up from top to bottom producing hits and runs and the defense making timely plays to end innings.
